## **GENERAL OUTCOMES**

Students will listen, speak, read, write, view and represent, to:

- 1. Explore thoughts, ideas, feelings and experiences
- 2. Comprehend literature and other texts in oral, print, visual and multimedia forms, and respond personally, critically and creatively
- 3. Manage ideas and information
- 4. Create oral, print, visual and multimedia tests, and enhance the clarity and artistry of communication
- 5. Respect, support and collaborate with others

## Areas of Study:

A variety of texts will be studied in the Semester 2 English 9 course:

- Romeo and Juliet
- Short Stories
- Film
- Provincial Achievement Test Preparation
  - o Part A (Written) Tuesday, May 9
  - o Part B (Multiple Choice) Tuesday, June 27
- Reading Logs (5% of Semester 2 Coursework)

Students will complete a variety of tasks that focus on specific skills, such as written response, reading comprehension, and project-based work.

Only Part B of the PAT will be used for the final course grade. All ELA 9 students will write a school-based Part A portion of their final exam in June, to also be used for the final course grade.
