GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to obtain an **Alberta High School Diploma**, students must meet these minimum requirements:

ALBERTA HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA: GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (ENGLISH)

The requirements indicated in this chart are the <u>minimum</u> requirements for a student to attain an Alberta High School Diploma. The requirements for entry into post-secondary institutions and workplaces may require additional and/or specific courses.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - 30 LEVEL

(English Language Arts 30-1 or 30-2)

SOCIAL STUDIES - 30 LEVEL

(Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2)

SCIENCE - 20 LEVEL®

(Science 20, Science 24, Biology 20, Chemistry 20 or Physics 20)

PHYSICAL EDUCATION 10 (3 CREDITS)

CAREER AND LIFE MANAGEMENT (3 CREDITS) 6

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GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be placed and remain on the Cochrane High School graduation list, all students must comply with certain conditions:

- Students are responsible to check the accuracy of their high school record of courses, marks, credits and demographic information. Detailed Academic Report can be accessed through student My Pass accounts. Any questions regarding a high school record should be discussed with Ms. Lebel.
- Students must ensure that they are registered in the necessary credits and courses to fulfill high school diploma or certificate requirements.

It is the **student's responsibility** to ensure that these requirements have been met!

GRADUATION MEETING

A mandatory graduation meeting is scheduled every year in early fall. Each grad and one parent must attend as we share important information about graduation and provide each student with a graduation package.

GOOGLE CLASSROOM

A Grad 2025 Google Classroom has been created to share information with grads and their families throughout the year. All grade 12 students who are in a position to graduate must sign up for the Google Classroom. Survey and ALL of the Up to Date information surrounding graduation in there.



VALEDICTORIAN

The Valedictorian has the honour of giving a speech at the graduation ceremony that shares the common memory, the realities of graduation, how to embody the 3 C's into adulthood and the future aspirations of the Class of 2025. This graduate is a student who strives for academic excellence while contributing to a positive school and community culture and who also exemplifies what it means to be a Cobra.

The Valedictorian will be selected through a three-step process, with a strong emphasis on excellence in academic achievement and how they embody the 3 C's of Community, Character and Commitment.

Step 1: A short list of the 10 top Grade 12 academic students using the following criteria:

- ELA 30-1
 - + four (4) other courses from the below list:
 - Social Studies 30-1
 - Mathematics 30-1, 30-2, and 31***
 - Science 30
 - Biology 30
 - o Chemistry 30
 - Physics 30
 - Fine Arts* (Art 30, Art 31, Choral Music 30, General Music 30, Instrumental Music 30, Drama 30, Dance 35, Fine Arts group locally developed courses like Advanced Acting 35, etc.)
 - Any 5-credit second language or language and culture course at the 30-level**– FLA, FSL, etc.
 - Physical Education 30
 - Aboriginal Studies 30 (not offered at CHS)
 - Any approved grade 12 IB diploma or AP academic subject (not offered at CHS)
 - CTS Computing Science 30 (5-credits) (not offered at CHS)

Notes:

*Two courses in the same subject area may not be used. For example: only ONE of Music, Band, Art, Drama, Theatre, or Advanced Acting may be used.

**Only one grade 12 level course in a language stream may be used (FLA or FSL).

***Mathematics 30-1, Mathematics 30-2, and Mathematics 31 may each be used.

An email will be sent to students inviting them to Step 2.



VALEDICTORIAN

Step 2: The short listed students will submit a video to the Valedictorian Selection Committee to demonstrate why they are the best choice for Valedictorian.

Step 3: Selection Process

- The Valedictorian Selection Committee will view the videos and score them according to a set rubric to determine the top 3 candidates. Students receive the rubric in advance.
- The top 3 candidates will prepare a two-minute speech hitting the highlights of their possible Valedictorian address in person, in front of the committee.
- The Valedictorian Selection Committee will assess the candidate's speeches and select the Valedictorian.
- The selected Valedictorian will then work with a staff member to craft their speech for the graduation ceremony.



GRADUATION CEREMONY

- The graduation ceremony will take place on Thursday June 26, 2025 at Spray Lake Sawmills Centre, Cochrane, beginning promptly at 9:00 am and lasting for approximately 2/2.5hours. Doors will open for guests at 8:15 a.m. Grads are to arrive no later than 8:00 am and proceed directly to the holding area. See map on next page for parking and student entrance at SLSC.
- Each family is eligible to receive 5 tickets for the event*. If families do not require all five (5) of their tickets, additional tickets may be available after the initial round of tickets have been distributed. A form will be sent to each Grad family to request tickets.
- The Graduation Ceremony will not be live-streamed in 2024-25
- Grads receive their gowns, cap and stole and tickets at our Mandatory Grad Rehearsal on Thursday, June 5th @ 12:30pm

GRAD BANQUET

The Grad Banquet is NOT organized by the school or Rocky View Schools (RVS). Participants and volunteers are not covered by any insurance or any other form of protection by the school or RVS. This is not a school sponsored event.

GRAD FEES AND TICKETS

This year's grad fees are \$160.00 and can be paid online through School Cash and must be paid in full prior to the graduation ceremony. The deadline to pay fees is April 11th 2025.
