b.Administration

Anne and Jen both provided some details on their experience and expressed they are excited to be at CHS which they consider to be a top high school in the province. CHS is a well-balanced high school with focus on fine arts, academics and athletics. With our 3 admin having academic experience in different core areas, they are able to provide support to all staff.

There are challenges with the uncertainty of funding. We are faced with large class sizes, and not able to hire additional staff. Currently 891 population, approximately 90 more students than projected. There are logistical challenges with accommodating larger class sizes but have ordered additional desks and chairs. New Staff are young and excited to be at CHS. Students and staff have accepted the challenges of full classrooms and are making best of it.

Class changes are being accepted on case by case basis. Priority is making sure students have core courses.

New Timetable Change Procedure introduced by Lauraine Laudel was well received. Having access to class availability & schedule in late August, prior to making class changes was very helpful for students.

All Teacher prep time is happening in the workroom because there isn't classroom space available. All available spaces are currently being used for classrooms.

d. Trustee Report (Fiona)

Division is waiting on provincial funding announcements. Enrolment, up over 900+ kids in division so all schools across division are feeling the crunch. Can't commit to hiring until we get budget, not sure if October or November. The MacKinnon Report recently released on provincial spending indicates the Province needs to reign in spending. The recommended fiscal restraints may be reflected in upcoming budget. The School Act became the Education Act on Sept 1, there has been some revisions. The Division is looking at the new regulations and how that impacts the schools. The announcement that Transportation could charge bussing fees as of September 1 is being assessed by the board. It is not clear if bussing fees can be implemented without losing existing funding that the NDP allocated for transportation.

The division has a new name, Rocky View School Division. No. 41 has been dropped from the name.

There are 8 boards in the Province that had 'Public' removed from their legal name. It is unclear why the UCP made this change but is raising some concerns among groups and boards about future funding models.
